

Article Formatting Requirements

Science, Technologies, Innovations

The journal *Science, Technologies, Innovations* accepts for consideration original scholarly articles in Ukrainian and English that correspond to the journal's academic profile and thematic sections. A manuscript must not have been published previously, must not be under consideration by another journal at the same time, and must be prepared in accordance with the principles of academic integrity.

The recommended length of an article is approximately 15,000–25,000 characters including spaces. A manuscript should contain the UDC, article title, information about the author or authors, an abstract, keywords, the main body of the article, a list of references used in the text, and a References section. The titles of structural sections may vary depending on the type of research, but the manuscript must clearly present the problem statement, review of previous research, aim of the study, methodology, results, and conclusions.

The title of the article should be informative and concise. The abstract should briefly reflect the aim of the study, methodology, main results, and conclusions, without repeating the title of the article or using generic statements and secondary details. The recommended abstract length is up to 1,800 characters including spaces. Keywords should be provided after the abstract and should include 5–10 words or word combinations.

Article metadata must be provided in the language of the manuscript and in English. This applies to the title, abstract, keywords, and author information. Submission of these elements in Russian is not required.

Formatting and Technical Requirements

The manuscript should be submitted in Microsoft Word, OpenOffice, RTF, or another compatible text format. The recommended font is Times New Roman, 14 pt, with 1.5 line spacing. The text should be consistent in style and should not contain excessive manual formatting. Quotation marks, apostrophes, dashes, abbreviations, units of measurement, and other formatting elements should be used consistently throughout the manuscript.

Tables, figures, charts, diagrams, and other illustrative materials should be placed in the text after their first mention. All tables and figures must be numbered consecutively and provided with titles. Table titles should appear above the table, while figure captions should appear below the figure. The text must contain references to all tables, figures, and formulae. Illustrations must be of high quality, legible, and suitable for editorial processing. For raster images, a resolution of at least 300 dpi is recommended. Charts and diagrams should remain clear both in color and in grayscale reproduction.

Formulae should be prepared using the built-in Word equation editor or a compatible tool. Formulae should be placed on separate lines, centered, and, where necessary, numbered with Arabic numerals in parentheses on the right. Mixing plain text and graphic images within formulae is not allowed.

References and Citations

In-text citations should be provided in square brackets. The list of sources used in the manuscript should be prepared in accordance with current bibliographic standards. A separate References section must be provided in Latin script and formatted according to APA style. For sources originally published in Cyrillic, transliteration should be used, with an English translation of the title in square brackets where necessary for a correct bibliographic description. DOI numbers must be included whenever available. The author is responsible for the accuracy of bibliographic data and all citations.

Author Information

Information about the author or authors must include the full name, academic degree and academic title where applicable, affiliation or place of study, position, city, country, contact e-mail, and ORCID. For multi-author manuscripts, the corresponding author should be clearly indicated.

Author Responsibility

The submitted manuscript must be fully proofread by the author before submission. The author or authors bear responsibility for the accuracy of the data provided, the originality of the text, the proper acknowledgment of borrowed materials, obtaining permission to use copyright-protected content, and compliance with the ethical and editorial requirements of the journal.
