ARTICLE TITLE

Abstract. *The abstract should be up to 1800 characters including keywords and spaces. The text of the abstract should avoid general phrases, insignificant details, and well-known statements. Direct repetition of any fragments of the paper should be avoided. The title of the article should not be repeated in the text of the abstract. It is not recommended to include tables, figures, schemes, diagrams, or formulae in the abstract, or to use abbreviations and symbols other than generally accepted ones. If abbreviations are introduced, they must be explained at first mention.*

Keywords: *5-10 words or phrases, separated by commas.*

INTRODUCTION

The relevance of the chosen topic is substantiated.

PROBLEM STATEMENT

The problem addressed by the study is described in general terms, as well as its connection with important scientific or practical tasks.

ANALYSIS OF RECENT RESEARCH AND PUBLICATIONS

This subsection provides an analysis of domestic and foreign works related to the research topic presented in the article. As a result of the source analysis, the previously unresolved parts of the general problem addressed by the article must be identified. References to sources are given in square brackets, for example [10], [9; 10], or [5-10]. Page numbers are separated by a comma [3, p. 35].

Purpose of the article - reflects the formulation of the article's objectives (task setting).

Depending on the type of study, the main body of the article may include the structural sections proposed below. Section titles may be chosen at the author's discretion.

Formatting of individual elements. All illustrations, software code, and tables should be placed near the text where they are mentioned.

Lists are formatted as follows:

- numbered - 1., 1), a), VI;
- bulleted - " - ", "•".

Formulae and individual mathematical symbols and letters used to denote quantities in the text must be typed in the MS Equation editor without borders or shading; alignment should be centered, with numbering in round brackets on the right. For example:

where i is the actual value of indicator for the execution of the i -th task.

Illustrations (drawings, photographs, technical drawings, schemes, graphs, maps, screenshots) and tables must be referred to in the text. Illustrations are designated by the word Fig., numbered consecutively with Arabic numerals, and centered. Titles of illustrations are placed after their numbers. If necessary, illustrations are supplemented with explanatory data (figure caption). The quality of illustrations must ensure clear reproduction and must not exceed the size of an A4 sheet, taking margins into account. Since the journal is printed in black and white, it is preferable to make drawings, graphs, and diagrams in black and white, in shades of gray, or using hatching. Illustrations must be legible, high-contrast, and editable.

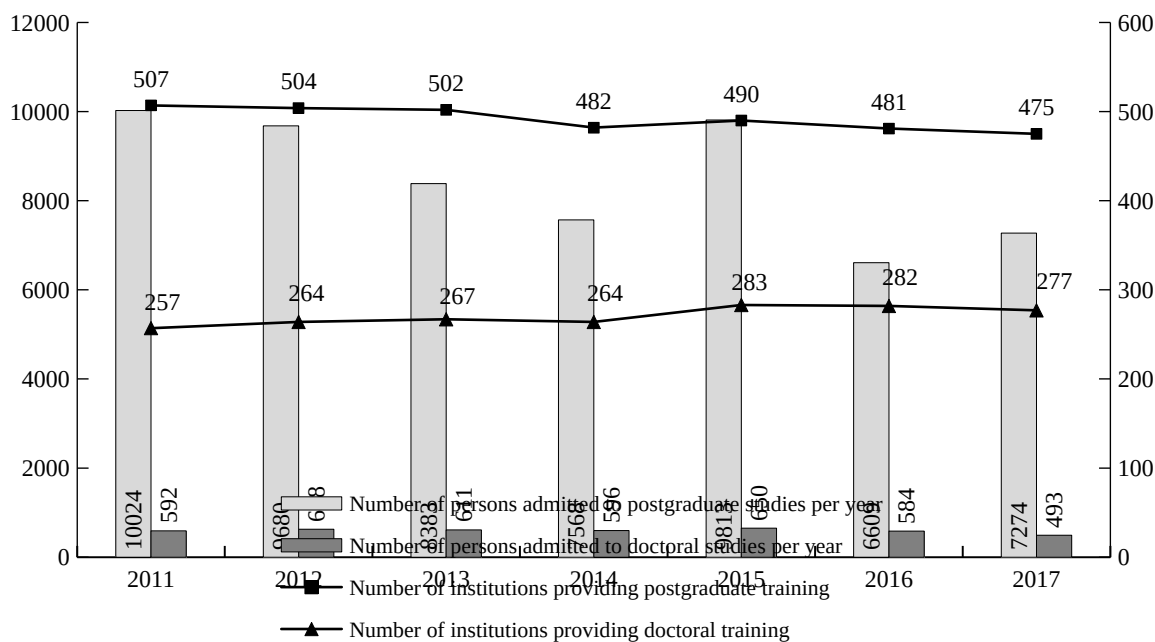


Fig. 1. Main indicators of postgraduate and doctoral studies activity in Ukraine in 2011-2017

Tables are numbered with Arabic numerals; alignment is centered. The caption *Table 1* should be in italics and aligned to the right. The format of the table title: centered, bold, placed above the table.

LIST OF REFERENCES USED

List of references used is compiled in accordance with the current standards of library and publishing practice, international standards, and national standards, in particular DSTU GOST 7.1:2006 "Bibliographic record. Bibliographic description. General requirements and rules for compilation". Sources in the list of references are numbered and arranged in the order in which they are mentioned in the text. The list of references should contain 10-30 entries. It is advisable not to include titles of legislative acts in the list and not to overuse authors' self-citations. The list of references should mention at least 2-3 articles published in scholarly journals during the last 12 months.

Use the official transliteration standard applicable to the source language.

Please note that references begin with the surnames and initials of all authors, and the year of publication is indicated in round brackets (2000). The title of the article or book is first given in transliteration, then in square brackets - in translation. Foreign-language sources are provided unchanged in accordance with APA.

Publication information: edition number (1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th), revised (rev.), enlarged (enl.), reprint (repr.), editor (Ed.).

If the description is prepared for a book, the language of the source is indicated (in Ukr.).

If the source has a doi, it is indicated at the end of the reference.

Titles of journals, conferences, organizations, publishers, and scientific institutions should be given in abbreviated form. Lists of abbreviations can be found at the following links:
